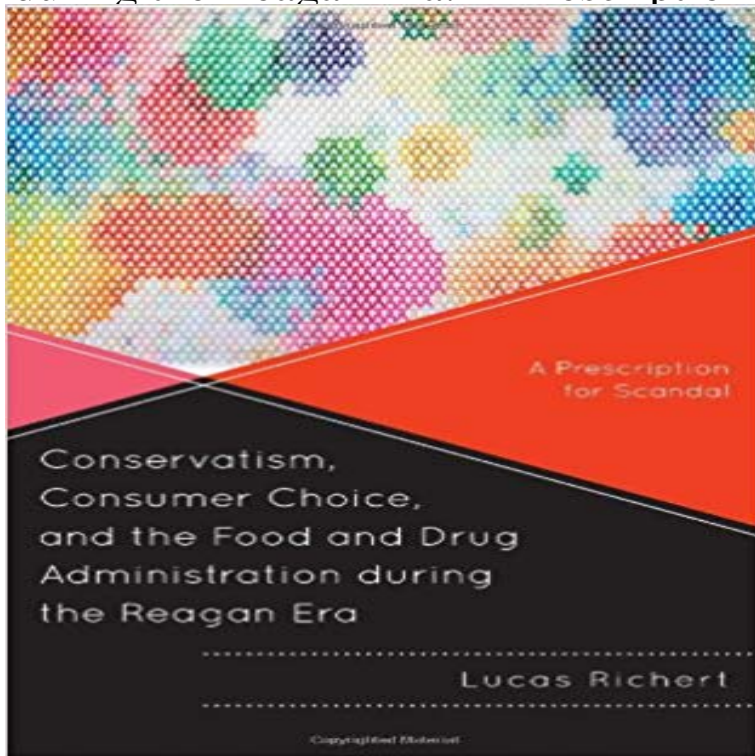


Conservatism, Consumer Choice, and the Food and Drug Administration during the Reagan Era: A Prescription for Scandal
