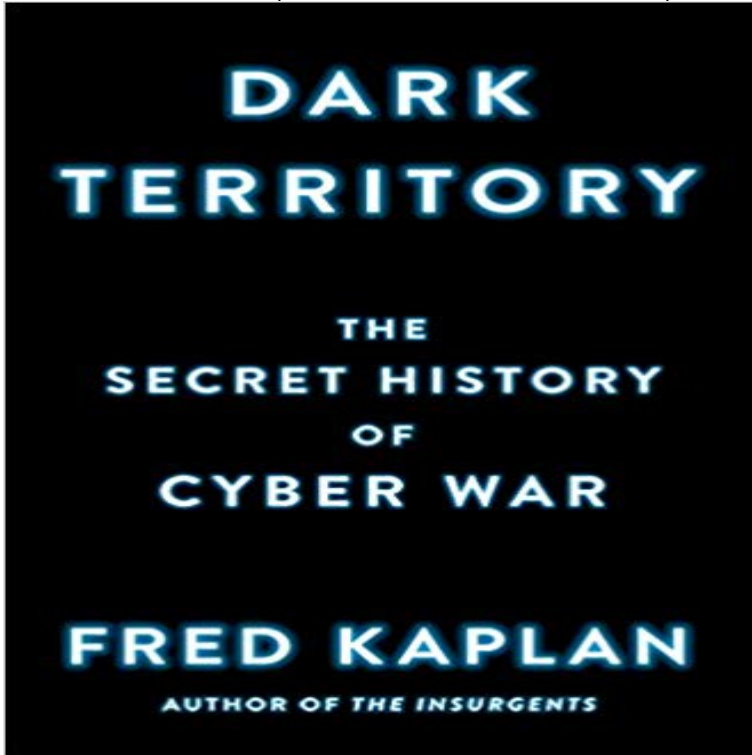


Dark Territory: The Secret History of Cyber War
