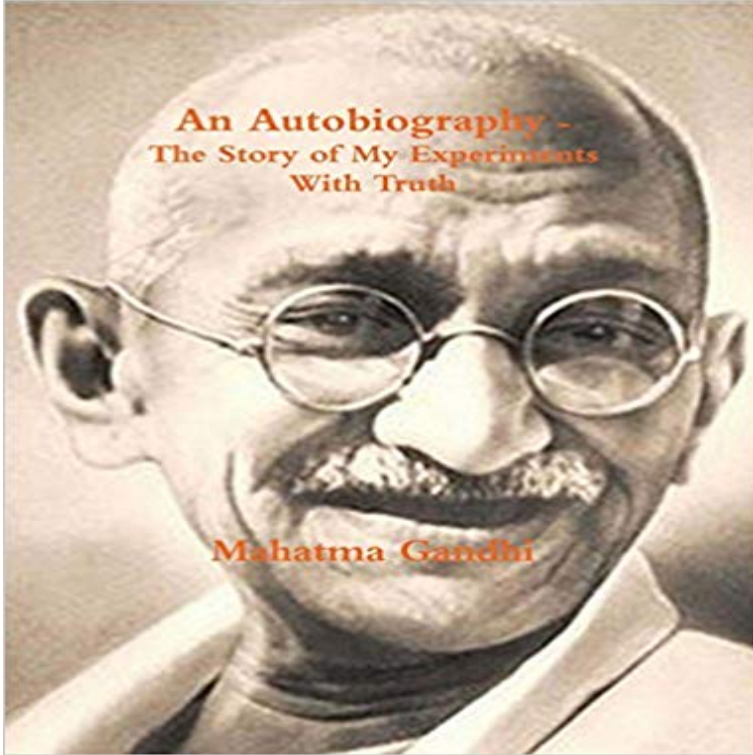


Gandhi, An Autobiography - The Story of My Experiments With Truth
