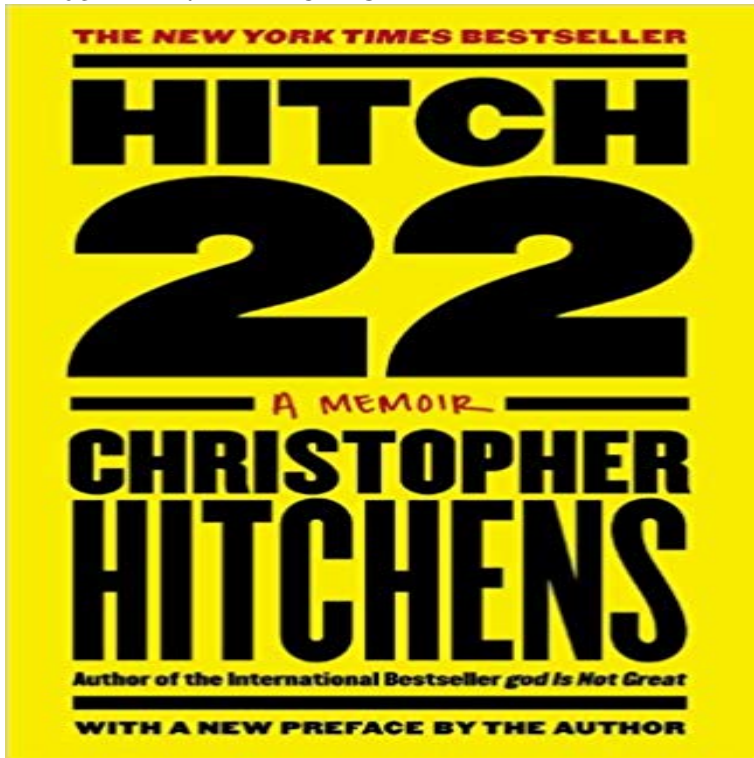


Hitch-22: A Memoir
