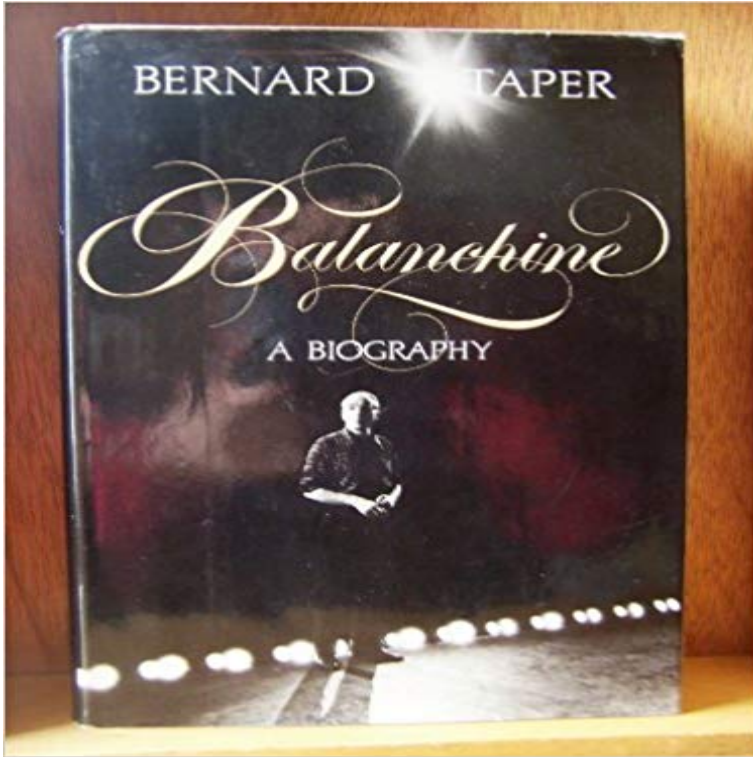


Balanchine
