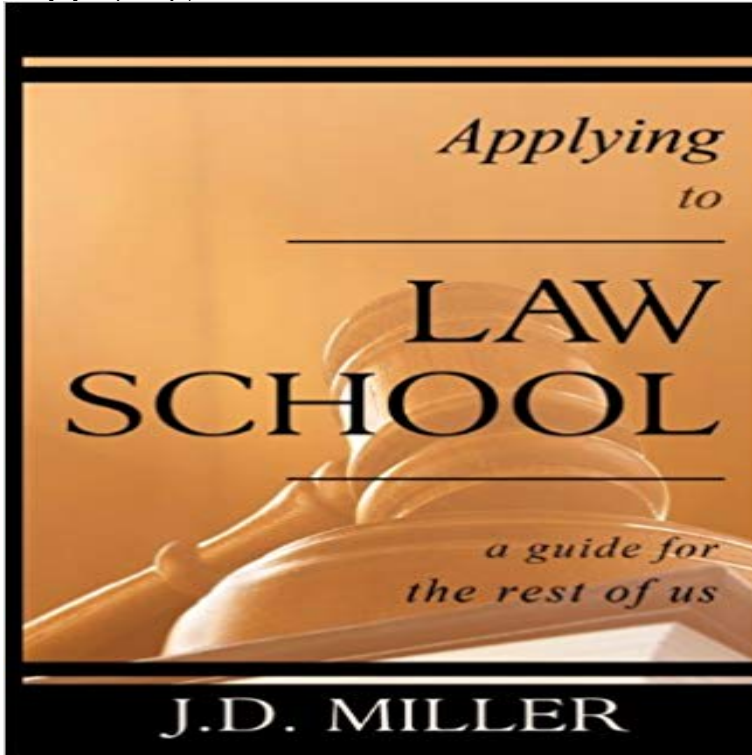


# Applying to Law School: A Guide for the Rest of Us
