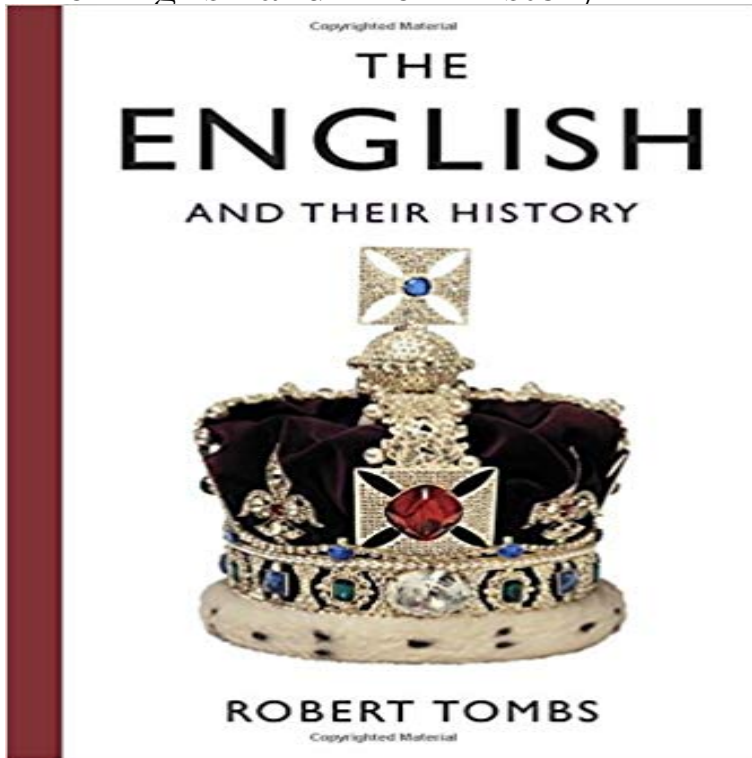


The English and Their History

These diverse and sometimes conflicting understandings are an inherent part of their identity.
